

City of Greensburg Board of Aviation Commissioners
March 22, 2010

The meeting of the Greensburg Board of Aviation Commissioners convened on Monday, March 22nd, at 7:00 p.m. All members were present. President Bill Ernstes called the meeting to order. Roll was called.

The agenda was presented. In old business, Gerald Hall memorial was added under Skydive Greensburg. In new business, Mortin Marcus was added under packet of bills. **Motion 235-10 Ed moved to accept agenda with the two additions. Jon seconded and the motion was carried.**

The February minutes were read. One change was noted. There was a typo in the AIP title. The correct title is AIP 3-18-0031-006. **Motion 236-10 with the typo correction, Jon moved to accept the February minutes. Don seconded and roll call was unanimous.**

Old Business: Bob of Skydive Greensburg presented a framed photo to Mayor Herbert where it will be placed in the hallway of city hall.

Bob questioned if Skydive could put the 182 on the tarmac for a couple weeks. Bill said no longer than a month.

Bob stated that there needs to be a resolution with the renting situation with Dean.

Bob finished with an apology to the Board for his comment on snow removal. He expressed his displeasure that his comments were misused by an individual in a blog or article against the airport.

Jon Dooley was able to get information for a memorial plaque for the late Gerald Hall. The Board discussed the details but no decision was made final. The Board will ask Gerald's widow, Alice for her opinion.

New Business: Martin Brunner has served the Board with a lawsuit for damages to his aircraft during a wind storm. Bill noted that the suit is being taken care of and might possibly be out of statute.

The packet of bills was presented. After a couple of general questions, **Motion 237-10 Jon moved to pay all bills including the extra Verizon bill. Jim seconded and the roll call was unanimous.**

The economic impact study being conducted by Mortin Marcus will hopefully be complete within the next month. Mortin has been delayed with health problems. Presently the airport is self-supporting and the Mayor noted that future revenue is anticipated. The Mayor also suggested that the Board check into the purchase of its own snow plow.

Jean Johannigman requested to speak. She stated she was unaware before this meeting that the BOAC transferred funds to the city to pay for snow removal.

Don Manley ended the meeting with several quotes from newspaper articles supporting airports and their positive impact on the economy. Several articles were directed to airports being neighbors to state parks.

Motion 238-10 Jim moved to adjourn the meeting. With Jon's second the meeting was dismissed at 7:33 p.m. The next scheduled meeting is Monday April 26, 2010 at 7:00 p.m.
